



Commandments of the Responsible Tourist at Amazon Planet



1. Inform yourself about the history, nature and culture of the place you are visiting.
2. Live harmoniously with nature. Observe it from a distance, without disrupting the habitat, do not collect, handle or attract wildlife. At the Taricaya Rescue Center, do not touch or feed the animals. Follow your guide's instructions at all times.
3. Respect the silence. Allow yourself to enjoy the sounds of nature; it is a great way to learn about it. Our bungalows are not sound proof so respect the other guests.
4. Use resources, like energy and water, with moderation. Remember they are limited resources.
5. Do not litter. Keep waste with you until you find the designated bins at the Lodge. Apply the 3Rs.
6. Do not smoke. Only in designated areas. Be careful with fire; do not leave candles on or unattended.
7. Walk on the marked trails and do not separate from your group. Do not swim in the river without your guide and always use the lifejacket when in the boat.
8. Make sure that the only print you leave is your footprint.
9. Share with your friends and family the possibility of experiencing what you have.
10. Donate or support the conservation and community projects we develop in the area.

SAVE ENERGY



At the Lodge, we use a gasoline generator for power and lights. We just turn it on for periods of the day to reduce the emission of Green House Gasses to the ecosystem and reduce our carbon footprint. We also use energy efficient light bulbs and fix any electrical problem right away to reduce our energy use.

Commit to conserve energy by following these simple rules:





SAVE WATER

At the Lodge, we use river water that is pumped into sedimentation tanks and purified with non-toxic elements. Although the rainforest seems to have a lot of water, it is part of the natural global cycle and the effect of waste or overuse might not be seen here but it affects other parts of the world. Also, taking water from the river and treating it for our use takes up energy that we can also reduce by using water wisely.

Commit to conserve water by following these simple rules:




WASTE MANAGEMENT



Did you know that all the waste in Puerto Maldonado is taken to the local dumpster with no segregation or treatment whatsoever? At the Lodge, we strive to develop a responsible consumption to **REDUCE** our waste, **SEPARATE** the waste each person generates to reduce what cannot be treated, **REUSE** what is possible and **RECYCLE**.

Commit to separate the waste you generate and apply the 3R by following these simple rules:



NON RECYCLABLES: Dirty toilet paper, dirty or wet plastic and paper bags and wraps, diapers, lady pads, etc.

RECYCLABLES: Rinsed plastic and glass bottles, clean and dry plastic and paper bags and wraps, clean and dry paper or carton.

ORGANICS: Food left overs, fruit peels, etc.
